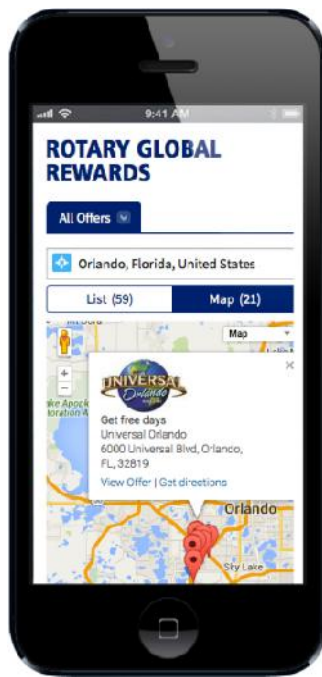

Welcome to New Generations Service Exchange Student



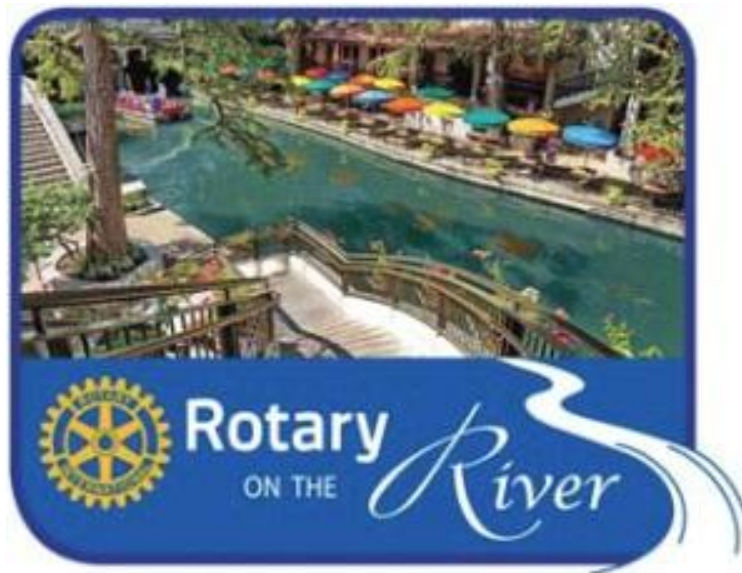

emerging leaders within our clubs and district. To learn why you should attend, talk to any PDG (or spouse) and visit:

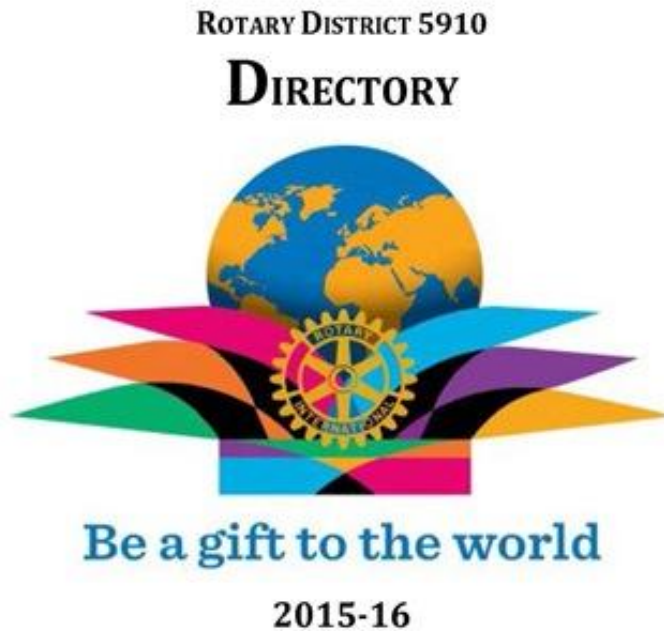

Beaumont Club Works on Project at Nutrition and Services for Seniors

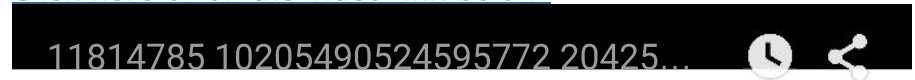

The Woodlands Club Enjoys Hearing about GSE in New Zealand

The Rotary Club of The Woodlands was pleased to have two members of the 2015 GSE (Global Study Exchange) program for District 5910 share their experience and some stories from this year's program to New Zealand.



Team Leader Jerry Springfield started off by explaining a bit about how the program works. A team and co-team lead, both Rotarians are responsible for selecting their team, all non-Rotarians who have been in their vocation for at least 3 years and are between 25 and 40 years old. The goals of GSE are to further the participants vocational understanding, cultural experience and fellowship by being immersed in another culture for four weeks.

Jerry's team consisted of a diverse group:

- Chris Kovacs (also in attendance) a high school teacher and coach in College Station
- Long Viet Le a police officer in College Station
- Heather Pitts a graphic designer in Bryan at Texas A&M
- Sarah Callahan a paralegal from Vidor who has since been accepted to law school

One of his main takeaways from his experience, which he has taken back to The Woodville Rotary Club, was the fact that the Rotarians and non-Rotarians that he met were so inviting and diverse. One of their host clubs had quite the characters with a 93 year-old member that showed them the sites, in the process logging about 8 miles of walking. Another was a 70 year old, ex-hardware store business woman with purple haired woman who still rides her Harley everywhere.

Chris Kovacs spoke of his experience as a Team Member and didn't have enough good things to say about the country and the people of New Zealand. He was a bit taken aback when he realized that everyone whom he met thought that if you were



from Texas that you needed to own a truck, own a gun and wear boots in addition to your 10 gallon hat. The teams' experiences ranged from visiting local schools and industry, to visiting the local sites in and around Dunedin on the southern coast of New Zealand. It gave Chris and his fellow Team members a great new appreciation for how similar the countries are even though they are separated by half a world, and yet distinctly different cultures.

Both Chris and Jerry reinforced a number of times the breath-taking beauty of the country believing that is "likely one of the most beautiful places on earth".

Jerry closed with a Facebook post from one of the team members:

"New Zealand. You have been very, very good to me-better than I deserve. When I left Texas 5 weeks ago, I don't think I had any idea what was really in store for me. You have been so far above and beyond my wildest dreams, and I am fundamentally changed. I've done things on this trip that I would normally never have tried, and some that I never imagined I'd ever get to experience. I've learned I'm braver and stronger and more adventurous than I thought, that it is possible to meet someone and love them after just a short time, and that I'm happiest when I'm in nature with the sun on my face and the wind in my hair. I'm heartbroken to leave, and yet excited to be home and see the ones I love. I'm coming back, New Zealand. Count on it."
